Later in the day an advocate ministered to a mom, patiently listening and encouraging "Showing Christ's love" included running snacks to her children in the atrium.



Near the end of the day, "Showing Christ's Love" meant giving a mom a break while she received diapers, clothes, and the opportunity to get a car seat through our parenting program. "Showing Christ's Love" was demonstrated by entertaining her children with books—which they got to take home—and a dance party that included music from the "Peanuts" movie. Kenza and her husband brought their adorable toddler along to the appointment.

Amid their anxiousness they proved to be a friendly couple. As the advocate interviewed them, they both spoke freely. They echoed each other, stating, "We just didn't expect to get pregnant right now!"

Kenza revealed that pregnancy had been very difficult for her in the past. Kenza's husband expressed significant concern about his wife's health. He said that if it came down to Kenza or the preborn baby's safety, his wife took priority.

Being able to process one's situation and concerns verbally can be powerful for most people.

During the ultrasound, the sonographer was able to alleviate some of their concerns.

As they left, they expressed how thankful they were for all the help and resources they received. Instead of frowns of concern, they had smiles of relief.


Kenza reported back that the doctor visit was reassuring and optimistic.
